The royal descendant of one of the five ancient kingdoms of Ireland, the Prince of the O'Reilly Family of the Royal Court of Breifne, returns to his homeland after a quarter of a century of living abroad. He has begun the process of reviving the court and kingdom in its original place in Ireland.

SYNOPSIS:

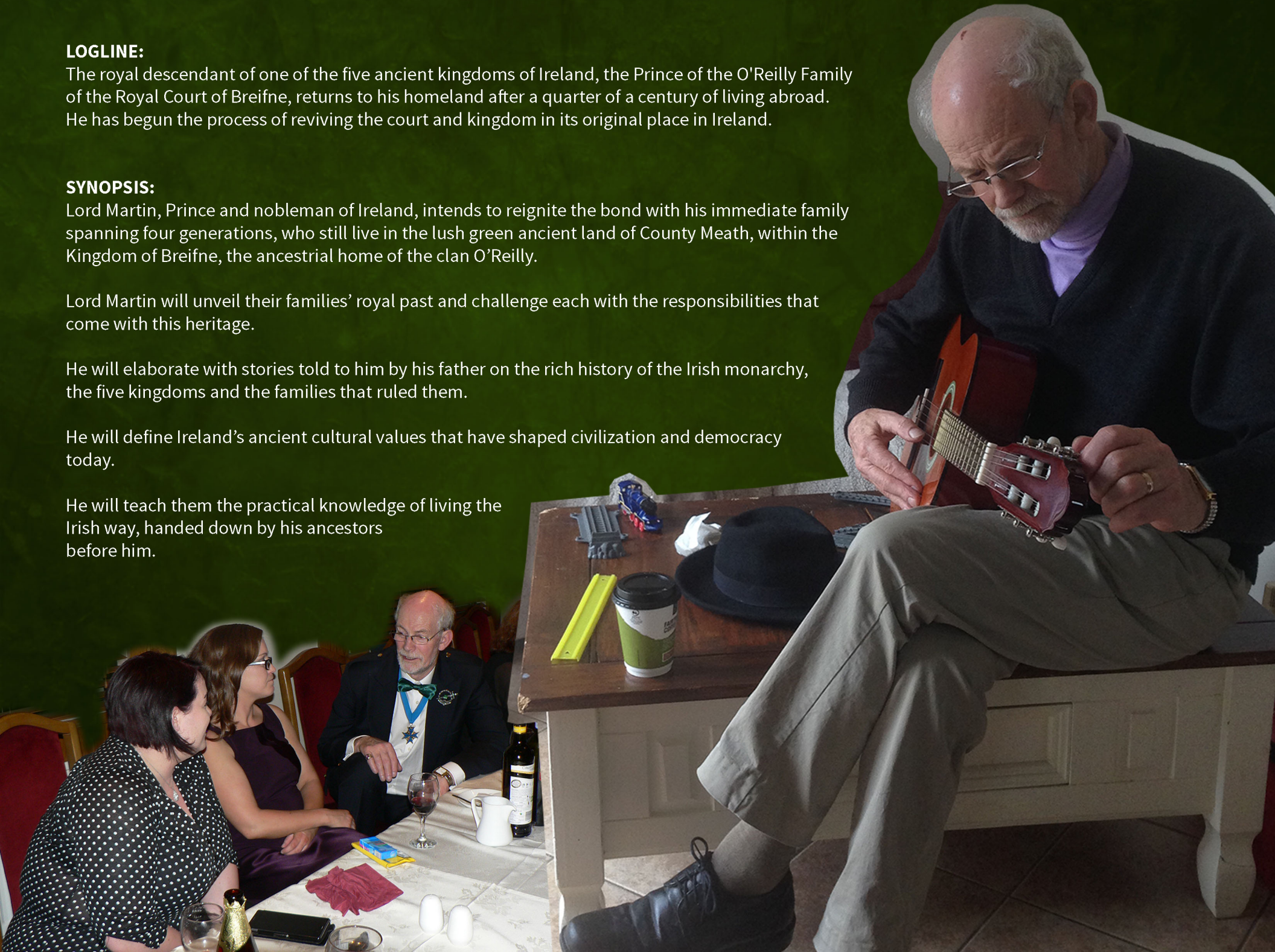
Lord Martin, Prince and nobleman of Ireland, intends to reignite the bond with his immediate family spanning four generations, who still live in the lush green ancient land of County Meath, within the Kingdom of Breifne, the ancestral home of the clan O'Reilly.

Lord Martin will unveil their families' royal past and challenge each with the responsibilities that come with this heritage.

He will elaborate with stories told to him by his father on the rich history of the Irish monarchy, the five kingdoms and the families that ruled them.

He will define Ireland's ancient cultural values that have shaped civilization and democracy today.

He will teach them the practical knowledge of living the Irish way, handed down by his ancestors before him.



THE SERIES:

Lord Martin and his Princess, Lady Ingrid, will set up a home in Ireland, close to his family and within the community in which Lord Martin grew up. They will open their home to the public to share knowledge, ideas and teachings of, the old Celtic ways, knowledge and skills like the very humane Brehon Laws, music and dance, history, old methods of farming, health care, education, the arts of fighting and many more aspects.

Each episode will dig deeply into each of these subjects:

- +Raise awareness of the ancient kingdoms and the old Irish way of life
- +Teach about the Celtic way of life
- +Engage in Research into the old Celtic ways and especially into the old Brehon Law
- +Reintroduce and re-integrate things that were beneficial in ancient times into today's society, on a local level
- +Encourage the Irish people to claim their rich and vital heritage and learn what has been lost

We will film the Prince and Princess, the immediate family, their friends, the members of the court and the local community for four months to cut the footage into series. There will be family and historical revelations, arguments, reconciliations, songs and storytelling around the fireplace.
